Any individual in North America retired from and not working in any segment of the metalcasting industry.

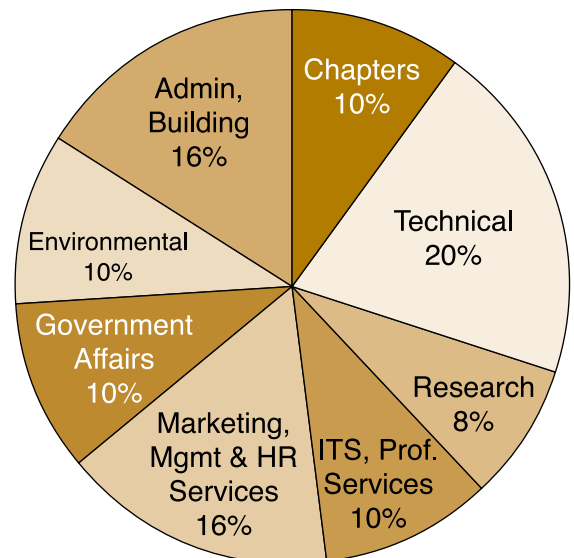
### Student—\$15 annually

To comply with the 1993 Tax Act six percent (6%) of your membership dues are attributable to lobbying expense for tax purposes. Whereas previously 100% of your Society dues were deductible as "expenses undertaken to maintain and improve professional skills," (I.R.C. Section 1.1625.5), as of January 1, 1994, lobbying expenses are not deductible (I.R.C. Section 1.162 (e)). (U.S. only)

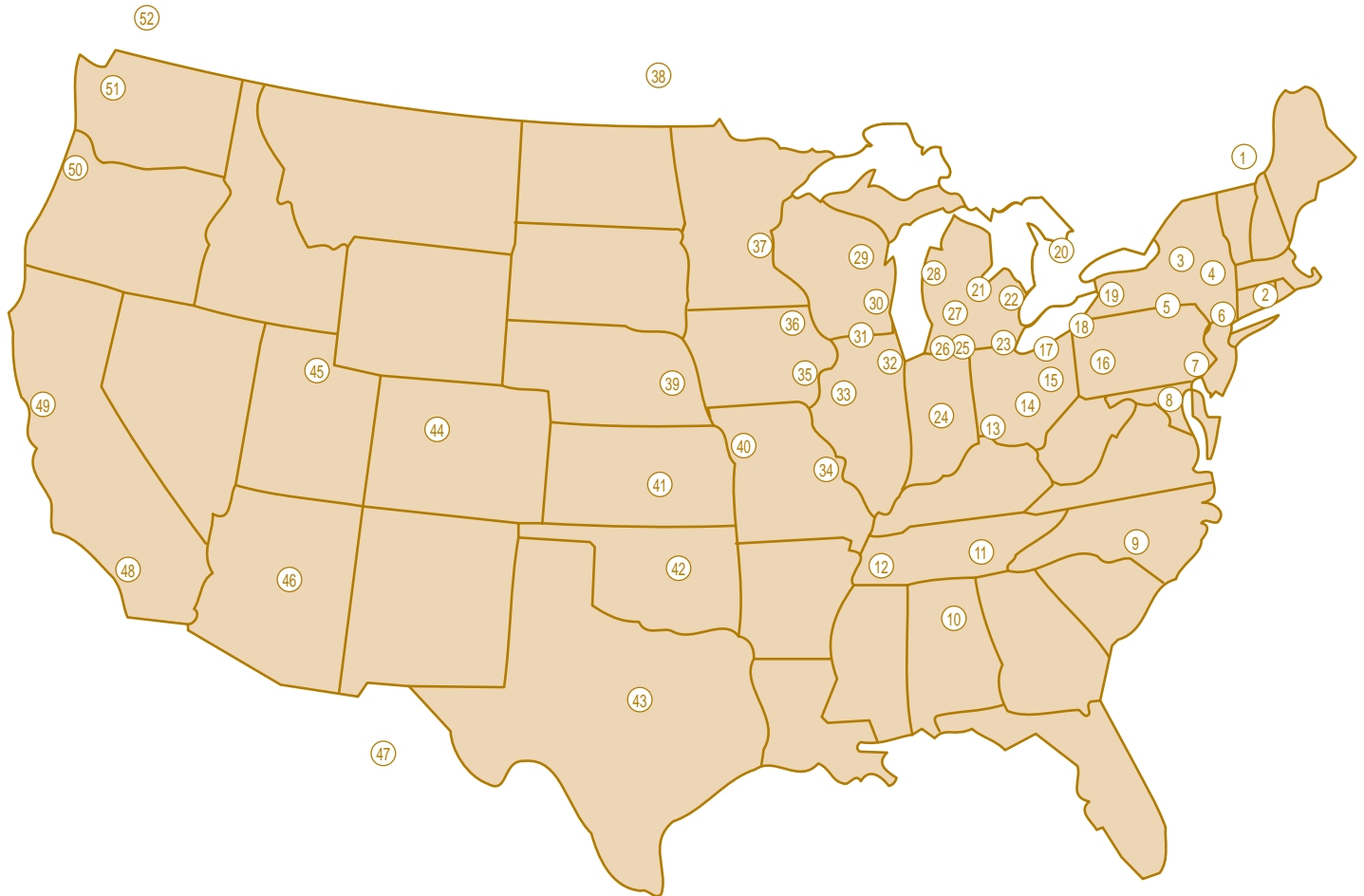
